SARGENTO FOODS TO BUILD 30TH HOME FOR MILWAUKEE HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

PLYMOUTH, Wis. – July 17, 2019 – Sargento Foods Inc. and employee volunteers will team up with future Habitat for Humanity homeowners to build the company's 30th Habitat home in the Milwaukee area. Sargento has partnered with Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity for 27 years and was the organization's first corporate sponsor.

This year's home build will take place from Wednesday, July 10 to Saturday, July 13, and Wednesday, July 17 to Thursday, July 18. The build is part of a multi-year commitment from Sargento to the Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity Midtown 100 project. Since 1992, Sargento has donated over \$1.7 million dollars and 13,372 volunteer hours to help Habitat combat Milwaukee's affordable housing crisis. The contribution has helped Habitat more than double the number of families they serve each year.
